

## PUTTING EVENTS

The Club holds weekly putting competitions on Wednesdays at the Grandview Golf Course. We avoid the complications of handling reservations and cancellations for our putting events by accepting all who show up before the check-in closing time.

A member who wishes to play must report to the **Check-In Table** prior to the specified closing time. There she pays the entry fee with three (3) \$1.00 bills and she receives her scorecard with her starting hole assignment. If a member brings a guest, the guest does not pay the entry fee and is not eligible to win prizes.

After Check-In is closed, all players gather to be briefed on the event and on other current Club matters by the officer in charge. Then they all go to their assigned holes and form groups of two player. There may be as many as four groups of two at each hole if the event is fully attended (144 players is considered a full field). When the officer in charge determines that all groups are ready, she blows the whistle for the simultaneous start at all holes.

Each player putts until her ball is holed out (or until she has taken 4 of the 5 allowed strokes) and then stands aside for the next player in line. Each player marks her scorecard with her own hole score and the hole score of her group partner and the check each other's cards. The play continues to the next hole until everyone has completed all holes. For maximum attendance, this requires approximately one hour and 20 minutes.

After play is completed, all cards are attested and are turned in to the **Pay-Out Table**. Those who have made one or more holes-in-one receive their Pay-out of \$2,000 per hole-in-one. After completion the Pay-Out leader completes a Tally Sheet and turns in the remaining money to the Club Treasurer for distribution to the golf course and to the Awards Chairman's account.

The Scores/Awards/Handicaps Chairman handles the scorecards after an event. She first checks the card for accuracy and records the scores. She then divides the field into "flights" and publishes the low net scores

in each flight. She uses the gross scores to update handicap, and she publishes these at least every two weeks. Finally, she allocates the remaining prize money to the low net scorers in each of the flights. Distribution of these award is held until the next quarterly Luncheon Meeting.
